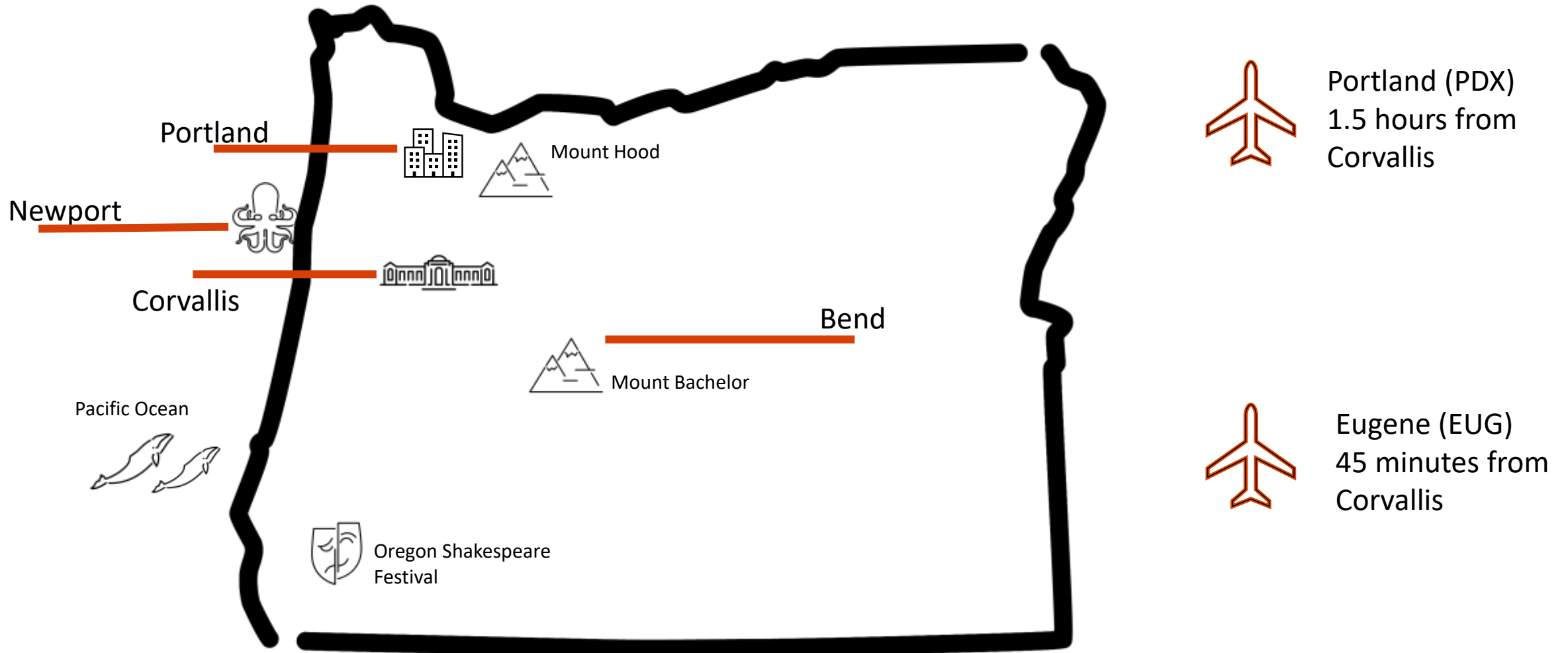

Oregon State University in Corvallis, OR is located within the traditional homelands of the Mary's River or Ampinefu Band of Kalapuya. Following the Willamette Valley Treaty of 1855 (Kalapuya etc. Treaty), Kalapuya people were forcibly removed to reservations. Today, living descendants of these people are a part of the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde Community of Oregon.

Research Your Options

Apply for Housing

Log in and apply through the housing portal at uhds.link/portal. There is no fee to apply!

3

Sign your Housing Contract

Sign your contract by June 30. If you are under 18 at the time of signing, a parent/guardian signature is also required.

4

Find a Roommate

Fill out the roommate questionnaire. Access to online roommate matching is determined by when the housing application is submitted.

5

Room Assignment

Room assignments begin on a rolling basis in late-July

6

Move In

Information about move-in day will be sent out over the summer. Welcome home!

HOW DO DINING PLANS WORK?

Choose your dining plan

New students choose between four plans. Generally, plan 1 should cover most meals most days whereas plan 4 may be closer to one or two meals each weekday.

Billing and paying for food

Each term, Dining Dollar amounts are billed to your OSU student account and added to your OSU ID like a debit card. Campus residents receive a discount when using their dining plan.

Need to change your plan?

Students can always increase their dining plan and can decrease it within the first 3 weeks of the term. Leftover money rolls over to the next term and to the next year.

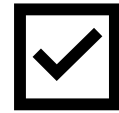

Awarded after students were admitted.

Renewable for total of four years at OSU.

SCHOLARDOLLARS

Academic department and additional OSU awards.

Selections released in March-May.

Reapply every year as a continuing OSU student.

FAFSA

Financial aid offer based on information from FAFSA.

Need-based awards (loans, grants, and work-study).

Financial aid offers show estimated cost of attendance and all aid awarded. Updated on student portal.



HOW DOES WUE WORK?

- WUE is not impacted by major
- Students who were not awarded WUE during the admissions process cannot be considered for WUE later.
- WUE **cannot** be stacked with the Provost Scholarship
- WUE is renewable based on meeting renewal criteria

SCHOLARSHIP NEXT STEPS

Apply for OSU ScholarDollars

Sign in to ScholarDollars using your ONID and DUO, regularly check ScholarDollars for new opportunities. Selections for awards in ScholarDollars are typically announced between March-May. Remember-students can apply for awards in ScholarDollars every year.

Accept Scholarship Terms & Conditions by May 1st

Carefully review renewal requirements terms and conditions in Beaver Basecamp by May 1st (WUE or Provost).

Apply for External Scholarships

If you are awarded a scholarship from an external organization, you can submit that information to Student Accounts to have it applied to your OSU bill.

DEGREE PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

Special Condition Appeals

If your financial situation has changed drastically from the taxes used for FASFA, you can submit an appeal with Financial Aid.



Financial Aid Package in Detail

A detailed version of the financial aid package is listed online, the letter is a condensed version.



Summer Savings

Summer term courses are billed at resident tuition rates. A great way to see additional savings.



Outside Scholarships

Student Account Services can provide direction on how to send that information to OSU.



Accessing ScholarDollars

Students will need to have both their ONID and DUO activated to access the ScholarDollars portal.

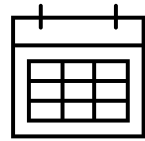


Got Questions?

Students can set up an individual meeting with a Financial Aid Advisor to cover detailed information about their financial aid package.

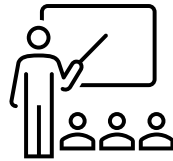


HOW DOES BILLING WORK?



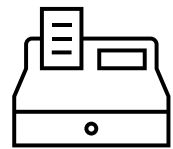
Quarter System

OSU has four terms (Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer). The primary academic year is Fall, Winter and Spring terms. Summer term is billed at resident tuition rates!



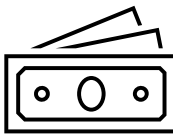
Register for Classes

Students will register for their first fall classes as part of their onboarding in the summer. How many credits and what classes they enroll in will determine the bill.



Financial Aid and Billing

Scholarships and aid are automatically applied to the bill each term. The final bill (remaining costs) will be available after the term has started. Your charges will start posting to your account in late Summer.



Payment Plan

Payment plans are available for students. More information about billing and payments are covered during Launch and via virtual webinars.

Financial aid offers – **beginning in March**



Accept financial aid and scholarship terms & conditions – **by May 1**



Tuition and fee assessment – beginning **around August 1** for registered students

- Adjustments will be made in real time as you add/drop classes



Bills become available to pay – **October 1**

- Bills will show awarded financial aid and scholarships as credits



Bills due – **November 1 (term begins Sept. 24)**

- Payment plans will be available in late summer, and you must either sign up for a plan or pay your bill in full

- Final High School Transcript (after graduation)
- Official College Transcripts (if applicable)
- Official ACT/SAT Scores (if you opted to apply with scores)
- AP/IB Scores (if applicable)



Submit Proof of Required Immunizations

- Submit through Student Health Portal

ONBOARDING/ORIENTATION

- Various online modules available starting May 5th (if ALEKS has been completed)
- Advising and registration will be done virtually and depending on your academic college's approach.
- **Launch** days (1-day programs) will be in-person with multiple dates throughout the summer (optional)
- **Connect** programming in the days following move-in and into first week of school.
